Preston International School is a co-educational Christian secondary school which was founded in September 2006 by Mr Toyin and Mrs Funmi Ajayi who are qualified U.K. trained educationists.

The school provides a safe, caring and structured environment in which students thrive and enjoy a happy and rewarding adolescence. The directors have not only put in place physical structures and facilities that enable the school to function properly but have developed robust school policies and procedures that produce a culture of excellence where expectations are clear throughout the school and where all students flourish. Preston International School is a full boarding school. There are no day students.

'Prestonians' (as our students are popularly called) perform very well in both internal and external examinations. As recipients of the British Council International School Award, we make bold to say that our teaching and learning curriculum has an international dimension and caters to the needs of children within and from outside Nigeria. ALL our students take the Cambridge IGCSE exams and we are a fully certified Cambridge School and a British

Council International Schools Award winner. We also sit for the WAEC SSCE and NECO examinations.

A good number of our students secure scholarships to further their education outside the country. Exams such as SAT, IELTS, TOEFL, and JAMB (UTME) are also on offer.

Our students compete in a variety of academic and sporting competitions and usually come out tops. In addition to excellent academic activities, we also provide a wide variety of extra-curricular activities that produce well-rounded students. We train students on musical instruments such as the piano, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, tuba, French horn, violin, viola, cello, drums etc. Also, there are numerous opportunities for sports and games and lots of clubs to join. The robotics and coding club is also very popular. Our students – both boys and girls, play soccer, volleyball, handball, basketball, cricket, badminton, tennis and a host of other games. There are two large swimming pools in the school – one for girls and one for boys. School life is vibrant and enjoyable for all our students.

School Organization

- Similarly, full time house parents who are university graduates look after the children in the hostels after school. The house parents support the academic work of students during prep time in the evenings in addition to their general care. The activities of the house parents are coordinated by the Head of Boarding.



Superb Facilities

- As a school offering world class education, our campus is set on approximately 70 acres of land with every desirable facility to make a child's six years residence a truly memorable experience. Our environment is tranquil and provides pollution free air which is very conducive to learning.
- Our students have access to well-stocked libraries, fully equipped laboratories, networked ICT suites with internet access, state-of-the-art language laboratory, art studio, design and technology workshop.
- The hostel facilities are also purpose-built with in-built accommodation for hostel parents right in the hostel. We have a large dining hall, health centre, sports field with swimming pools and the tuck shop (rotunda). All our buildings are highly effective and functional. For the comfort of our students, public power supply is generously complemented by our own electricity generating sets with dedicated transformer.



- Despite the fact that all these costs a lot of money, our fees are charged with our passion and mission in mind – to offer world class education at a fraction of the usual cost to the average Nigerian family. When compared with similar schools, our fees have been described as very reasonable.

Curriculum

Overview

- We offer a broad and balanced blend of the NIGERIAN and CAMBRIDGE (CAIE) CURRICULUM. Preston International School operates 3 years of Junior Secondary School and 3 years of Senior Secondary School in line with the Nigerian 6-3-3-4 system of education. However, within this structure, we have carefully mapped out and overlaid the delivery of the British Curriculum so that all our students write the Cambridge I.G.C.S.E. in their final year – SS3 in addition to the Nigerian S.S.C.E. (N.E.C.O.) and (W.A.E.C.) thus giving them opportunity for three (3) final year examinations. We also prepare our students for the American S.A.T. (Scholastic Aptitude Test) by College Board and the IELTS / TOEFL exams which are optional courses/exams for students who wish to study abroad.



Junior School

- At the Junior Secondary School, we follow the Nigerian Curriculum (JSS1 – 3) subjects: Mathematics, English Language, Basic Science and Technology, Pre – Vocational Studies (Agricultural Science and Home Economics), Business Studies, National Values Education (Civics and Social Studies), CRS, Creative and Cultural Arts (Fine Arts and Music), French, ICT, PHE, and Yoruba. They also write the NECO BECE (Basic Certificate of Education) and the Ondo State Basic Certificate of Education at the end of JSS 3.

Senior School

- At the Senior Secondary level, our students offer the following Cambridge IGCSE subjects: English Language (First Language), Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Further Mathematics, Geography, ICT, Design and Technology, Food and Nutrition, Religious Studies, Economics, French, Music, Art and Design, History, Accounting, Business Studies.
- Preston International School is a C.A.I.E. (Cambridge Assessment International Examinations) accredited examination centre (NG 079) registered to offer and write I.G.C.S.E. examinations.
- The WAEC and NECO subjects on offer are: English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Further Mathematics, Geography, Technical Drawing, Christian Religious Studies, Economics, French, Music, Fine Art, Accounts, Agricultural Science, Animal Husbandry, Business Studies, Civic Education, Commerce, Data Processing, Food and Nutrition, Government, History, Computer Studies, Literature, Yoruba.

Set on approximately 70 acres of land, Preston International School is set up in a green environment that provides pollution free air and a tranquil environment that is very conducive to learning and meditation.

Our buildings are purpose-built and designed by the proprietor, Mr. Toyin Ajayi who is a graduate of Architecture and Design from the University of Lagos and a seasoned teacher of Design. Mr. Toyin Ajayi says "...the design concept guiding the architecture of Preston International School was done in a way to achieve a feeling of home away from home".

This is presented through the development of highly efficient and functional buildings which exude comfort, fun and relaxation. They are also very responsive and complement the country-side location of the school.

Overview Of Campus Life



At Preston, we encourage our students to enjoy being students. We recognise the importance of the adolescent years as a 'make or break' phase in life. Therefore, our programmes are designed to develop our students into fine, well-rounded, well-educated, well-cultured, respectable, God-fearing ladies and gentlemen. Testimonies abound from parents, leaders in various communities and the students themselves of how their attendance at Preston has led to a positive transformation of their lives. Campus life is enjoyable with lots of activities to engage all our students.



Sports

Pupils at Preston International School have plenty of opportunities in undertaking sporting activities. We believe that sport and fitness are integral to a holistic education, providing lifelong pleasure and fulfilment, relaxation, exercise, self-esteem and team spirit.

Arts & Crafts

Students choose from a wide variety of artistic activities such as drawing and painting, pottery and sculpture, murals, clay modelling, print making, tie and dye and papier mache.

Excursions

The most memorable learning experiences often take place off campus. Preston International students enjoy the opportunity to be involved in field trips to industrial, historical and architectural sites both in and outside of the country.

Music

In terms of self-expression, self-awareness and interpersonal skills, the arts are central to the school's holistic ideals. Music provides the lifeblood for the health and vitality of the whole school community. Students learn to play a wide variety of instruments.



Media Skills

The media is central to 21st Century life. Both parents and teachers often stress 'personality development' as a central issue of a holistic education. Our students are taught to express themselves clearly, knowledgeably, confidently and with conviction in a variety of situations. There is an active and vibrant Press Club with up-to-date technological equipment such as camcorders, digital cameras and video-editing software used confidently and competently by our students.



Debates & Public Speaking

Prestonians are known for their self-confidence in public speaking and ability to engage in debates. The regular inter-house debate tournaments ensure that our students engage in debates on a variety of hot topics which are quite electrifying, sprouting opportunities for the development of public speaking. Also, during daily assemblies, Prestonians have the opportunities to make presentations which could be musical, drama, poetry or short speeches. Our students regularly compete with other schools locally and nationally and they usually win. It is the school's objective to ensure that every child has the opportunity to develop their oratory and public speaking skills.



House Parents

The care of Prestonians is uppermost in the hearts of the proprietors such that they have employed six house parents each per house, making twenty-four substantive house parents whose full-time job is to manage a small group of students. All house parents are university graduates. Therefore, they are able to support the academic work of students during prep time in the evenings in addition to their general care. The family atmosphere at Preston provides a secure environment within which strangers rapidly become friends. The 'House Fathers' and 'House Mothers' liaise closely with other teachers to monitor the quality of the students' prep and other academic work. Most importantly, the house parents carry a major responsibility for the happiness and integration of students and are supervised by the Head of Boarding.

Dining

The 800-seater dining hall is the venue for day-to-day dining and also for regular formal dinners. The Tuck Shop also provides snacks and other consumables for the children's conveniences and well-being.



Safety & Security

Our carefully appointed teachers, house parents and well-equipped security staff work together to ensure that a safe and secure school is ours. The school campus is fitted with CCTV surveillance covering all areas. Also, fire extinguishers are sufficiently provided as well as emergency procedure training in place.

Medical Care

The school has a well-equipped health centre where students are looked after by competent, qualified health practitioners. Our nurses are also resident on the school premises and are available 24/7 should any child fall sick.



school fees policy, structure & billing arrangements

Overview

School fees are paid termly. However, parents who wish to pay annually are allowed to do so but this does not attract special discounts. Should there be variations in the fees due to additional items or inflation, such parents who have paid the annual fees will need to pay the difference. All fees are to be paid in full before resumption each term.

Parental Responsibility

Preston International School (RC 643308) is a limited liability company duly registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission as a business. As much as we are an educational institution, we rely solely on school fees to meet all our obligations as well as maintain our relevance in a highly competitive industry. This is why parents are advised of the fee structure, making it imperative that parents fully understand and commit themselves to fulfilling their obligations to pay in full and on time. Therefore, parents have a moral and legal obligation to pay school fees.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are charged every academic term. This relates to fees charged for teaching expertise and all personnel costs relating to teaching and learning right from senior managers who oversee teaching activities right through to the clerical officer and junior staff responsible for the smooth running of academic services.

Cambridge Fees

Preston International School is a fully registered and active member of the Cambridge Schools. It is therefore compulsory that ALL students at Preston International School sit for the IGCSE Cambridge Assessment International Exams.

The tuition, books and resources for the IGCSE exams are paid as part of the school fees in the senior classes while the actual exam registration fees are paid under an instalmental payment plan. The instalmental payment plan is based on the registration of five (5) subjects. Parents are however allowed to register their children for up to eight (8) subjects but the registration costs for the additional subjects will be paid by parents at the point of entering students for the exams. Our students sit for the Cambridge exams in October/November – the first term of their SS3 class. Results are released in January, giving our students the opportunity for early applications into universities within Nigeria and abroad.

Siblings Discount

Parents with more than one child at the school are offered discounts on the 2nd, 3rd and 4th child as follows. 1st Child – full fees, 2nd Child – N12,000 less on tuition, 3rd Child - N18,000 less on tuition, 4th Child – N24,000 less on tuition.

Learning Resources

This is an annual charge for the provision of study materials which includes text books and exercise books, as well as the provision, maintenance and upgrading of physical and electronic resources used in the school for educational purposes such as ICT, internet facilities, classrooms, laboratories and specialist rooms, photocopying, lockers, and such overheads associated with running the academic section of the school.

Boarding

This relates to fees charged for boarding and it includes feeding (breakfast, lunch and dinner) and all other services related to providing decent care and conveniences in the boarding house system and staffing costs.

Uniforms

We operate a uniforms shop from where parents purchase uniforms for their wards as needed. The cost of uniform items is subject to review as a result of fluctuating exchange rates. The school requests that parents purchase at least three sets of uniforms and house wears for their wards. Payment for uniforms can be made into the uniforms account after which uniforms will be issued to the students in school. The school embroiders the names of students on the uniforms for a small charge.

Tuck Shop

The tuck shop provides a variety of needed general supplies and snacks for the students such as their mid-day snacks, night cap, stationery, personal supplies such as soaps, detergents and such which may need replacement or replenishment from time to time. It is a top up account which replaces the traditional 'pocket money' system. A DEPOSIT of N25,000 is paid into the Tuck Shop Account from where the children spend their money. At the end of the term, it is required that parents 'top-up' the account. This is not part of the school fees.

Development Levy

This is a one-off payment for new entrants to the school.

Caution Fees

This is a refundable deposit which is held by the school for two purposes. Firstly, it is a security deposit for the replacement of any school item or property damaged should the bill to replace such damaged items fail to be settled and the perpetrator fails to return to the school. This includes books and resources that are on loan to the student. Secondly it is a holding fee which will be refunded when students leave the school and have been cleared. The caution fee shall be refunded without interest upon a child's permanent departure from the school.

Withdrawal Fees

It is the school's policy that parents are required to give the school one term's notice in writing and to receive an acknowledgement in writing in the event that they will be withdrawing their child(ren) from school. This gives the school ample time to fill the place and/or adjust its budget for the next term. The school will charge one full term's fees in lieu of notice if a term's notice in writing is not given.

PTA Dues

Preston International School has a thriving Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) which supports the school through the giving of prizes to students who excel in various subjects on prize-giving days and also carrying

out projects that are of direct benefit to the academic achievement and welfare of the students of the school. The PTA dues are paid into the PTA account and is charged per family rather than per student. The PTA Executive members (Exco) are drawn from parent leaders around the various zones in the country. There are various PTA zones that parents can belong to depending on their location. Upon resumption, parents are introduced to the zonal leaders and also benefit from the zonal transportation arrangements where reputable transport companies transport the children to and from the school. Parents also support one another through a welfare system and develop friendships depending on what operates in the zones.

Mode of Payment

The accounts department issues bills at the end of every term stating the accounts to be paid into by online transfer or other means by the parents. No cash, cheques or electronic payments are collected in the school premises. All payments are made directly into the school's accounts. It is mandatory for parents to submit copies of evidence of payment to the school – tellers and online transfer receipts should be sent to the accounts department via electronic means or in print before resumption. Parents who pay by cheque must allow for the cheque to have cleared before resumption. Receipts for all payments and clearance slips are issued by the accounts department. Students are not admitted into school without the clearance slips.

The Board of Directors has the responsibility to review and set school fees yearly or from time to time. The key factors taken into consideration when reviewing school fees include inflation, staff compensation growth curve and profit margins to ensure a healthy and thriving school.

The Board of Directors in carrying out these duties will make every effort to ensure that the increase in school fees are reasonable and communicated in a timely manner to allow for parents to plan and make the necessary adjustments to their school fees budget. A minimum of one term's notice of an increase in school fees shall be given.

International School Award

Preston International School has obtained the prestigious British Council International School's Award – an endorsement of Preston International School's commitment to developing and incorporating an international dimension into our teaching and learning curriculum. The school undertakes projects relating to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), working with partner schools in UK, India, Pakistan and Israel.

Salem Academy of Music

The school has a music academy named Salem Academy of Music where students learn how to play musical instruments to a very high standard and also have the opportunity of undertaking professional certified music examinations of bodies such as the A.B.R.S.M. (Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music) and M.U.S.O.N. (Musical Society of Nigeria).

Membership of the Academy is charged annually at N60,000.00 (Sixty-thousand Naira only for the entire academic session). We do require that the child has an orchestral musical instrument which can be bought privately or can be purchased through the school. We believe that having standard international levels of musicianship will enhance a child's life chances, give them tools and skills for worship (Psalm 150), more fulfilment and enjoyment in life and that little edge when needed in this increasingly competitive world that we live in. We know that joining Salem Academy has been of tremendous benefit to our former students during the selection process of gaining admissions into higher institutions abroad and in many other ways.

Swimming

Students at Preston International School also have the opportunity of taking swimming lessons. This is charged at N10,000 per term presently.

Sports

All our students enjoy a variety of sporting activities which include track and field events and other ball games such as football, volleyball, basketball, handball, table tennis and cricket. An annual inter-house sports competition is held.

Excursions & Trips

Our students have the opportunity of travelling to various destinations within and outside the country on trips and excursions to further broaden their horizon and educational experience.

Duke Of Edinburgh International Award

Preston is one of a network of schools offering the Duke of Edinburgh International Award to students aged 14 years and above. 'The Award' is an international award which challenges young people to dream big, celebrate their achievements and make a difference in their world.

Community Service Clubs – Man O' War, Army Cadets, Boys and Girls Brigade, Red Cross, Road Safety and Scouts. Here, children learn to give of themselves and their resources as patriotic citizens in a highly disciplined and well-structured set up. Programmes are designed around bringing the best out of every child in terms of understanding their civic responsibilities in society.

school policies you should know about

Overview

Here are some of the school policies, rules and regulations which you should know about in advance and which we hope will answer a lot of the frequently asked questions by new parents and students:

Does the School have Visiting Day(s)?

We do not have visiting days. Our students have a break every six weeks for half-term and end of term holidays. In consideration of parents from distant places and the state of our roads, reducing the risk associated with travelling every three weeks is of utmost importance. It is also for this reason that school programmes that require parents to be in attendance are fixed for end of term or end of half-term so that parents can return with their children without having to come to the school exclusively for those programmes. Such programmes include inter-house sports day, student review days, prize giving days and graduation ceremonies.

Does the School Allow Students to Come to School with Items Described as 'provision' or Food Items?

No. Since the school started, we have not allowed students to come to school with provision for three reasons. Firstly, the school feeds the children well and as such, there is no need to bring provision from home. Our students eat five times a day as follows: breakfast, mid-day snack (which is quite filling), lunch, dinner and night cap. Having provision in the school ruins their appetite for eating the healthy meals provided by the school and it does not produce well-adjusted children who eat good food placed before them and may breed students with poor attitude to feeding.

Secondly, the school promotes equity. Traditionally, students become competitive about the kind of snacks/provision they bring from home in terms of costs and exclusiveness, which then leads to bullying, theft and other social and emotional menaces. Lastly, Preston is located in a sub-urban area with lots of vegetation surrounding it. The last thing we want is to encourage rodents from the bushes around to visit the hostels which then poses a serious health hazard.

Does the School Allow Students to Bring in their Mobile Phones, Tablets or Laptops?

No. The school does not allow students to carry their own mobile phones, tablets, laptops and electronic games devices etc. Parents are able to speak with their children at weekends through the telephone numbers provided by the school. Each house has four (4) official telephone numbers through which the parents may speak with their children. Parents are not allowed to call the personal telephone numbers of the house parents or any other member of staff to reach their child(ren). The school has a dedicated 24/7 internet connection which enables parents and children to communicate through emails.

What are the Health Care Arrangements in School and How Do Parents Get to Know if their Ward is Ill?

The school has a well-equipped and well-staffed purpose-built health centre headed by a qualified matron who leads a team of five nurses who are resident in school. The health bay has two wards – one for girls and one for boys, where students who are unwell are observed whilst undergoing treatment. Parents are informed early by the Head of Boarding if their ward becomes unwell and may need to be taken to the hospital in town to see the doctor. We have reputable private hospitals that we refer students to following the matron's advice. The health centre in school only provides primary health care. Parents may also be asked to come and collect their children for medical attention where necessary e.g. for chicken pox or other infectious diseases.

Where a child is treated in a health facility outside the school, the parents will be invoiced directly and payment made to their account.

What is the School's Policy on Uniforms, Jewellery, Make-up and Hair-do?

The school uniform consists of light blue shirt, dark grey trousers and skirt, navy jumper, navy blazer and school's blue silver lined tie. Black school shoes (plain black shoes without laces for boys and Mary-Jane style school

shoes for girls with a single strap across) to be worn with white socks and this is provided by parents. The house wear consists of light blue polo neck t-shirt, brown chino cargo shorts for boys and brown chino skirts for girls. Brown sandals and black socks are provided by parents. Besides the footwear, all uniform items are provided by the school. Parents are not allowed to sew uniforms but are required to purchase from the school only. Small, plain gold or silver studs are the only earrings allowed for girls. No make-up, nail varnish or paints are allowed. Girls are required to plait their hair in school (fortnightly) or braid their hair. Boys are not permitted to wear any jewellery.

Does the School Suspend or Exclude Students for Poor Behaviour?

Yes. The school does suspend students from school as punishment for certain offences. In such cases, parents of the child who offends and is suspended from school come over to take possession of the child and return him or her back to school after serving out the suspension.

Does the School Organize Transportation To and From the School for Students?

Parents of our students run zonal parents' associations and do have transportation arrangements with reputable companies to convey the students to and from school. Lists of new parents with their contact details are forwarded to the leaders of the zonal parents' associations who then make contact with the new parents to welcome them and introduce them to other members in their zones.

Do New Students Resume Before Other Students?

At the commencement of every academic session, all students – old and new, resume on the same day. This is because quite a number of our students have siblings who are new students. Having different resumption days will task parents to make two trips from very distant places. During resumption days, students go through a thorough check to ensure that they have all items on the boarding house list and that they are properly labelled as instructed. Items not labelled will be returned. Similarly, students are not allowed into the hostels until they have all their boarding house items. Parents are not allowed into the hostels on resumption days for security reasons as there are usually lots of people on the premises on resumption days. The house parents, and school prefects do a good job to give the new students a helping hand and support them in settling them down in the hostels.

Parents are allowed to arrange with the school office manager should they wish to visit the hostel during term time but not on resumption days. When going on holidays and when returning to school after the holidays, all students are expected to be fully dressed in their school uniforms as good ambassadors of Preston International School. Students are not to return to school in their house wear or mufti.

Are Students Allowed Out Of School For Any Reason?

Our students are allowed out of school for special reasons when parents formally request in writing for them to be released from school for the following reasons: Attending visa interviews, special tests and interviews related to college admissions, and medical appointments. Attendance of social functions and casual visits to the school are not allowed.

Are Students Allowed To Celebrate Birthdays In School?

For the purpose of ensuring equity in the school, parents are not allowed to bring in birthday cakes and food into school for birthday celebrations. Parents are encouraged to wait till the children come home for holidays so they can have their birthday parties at home. However, if parents will like their children to celebrate their birthdays in school, a modest cake and light refreshments can be purchased through the school's Tuck Shop at a very reasonable cost.

How Does Preston Deal With Bullying?

We take bullying very seriously and we deal with it effectively. We have 3 categories of offences at Preston and bullying is categorised as a 3rd degree offence which attracts permanent exclusion of a child who persists in the act. We have a culture of having 'eagle eyes' where staff and students are trained to look out for signs of bullying and report the slightest indication of suspected bullying. The excerpt from the students handbook 'The Preston Scrolls' aptly captures our stance –

"Bullying is prohibited and viewed very seriously by the school. Bullying is defined as any wilful attempt to frighten or hurt another person physically or emotionally especially when accompanied by an apparent present ability to do so or any intentional display of force such as would give the victim reason to fear or expect immediate bodily harm. We operate a 'three strikes' policy on bullying. In other words, bullies will be expelled from the school after three confirmed acts of bullying."

In addition to the above, we hold a week-long 'ANTI-BULLYING' week where students are educated and enlightened about bullying and its consequences. We promote a positive culture of caring for one another. The reputation that the school has built over the years is such that parents and students are comfortable and are satisfied with the way and manner that the school deals with bullying.
